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MARRIAGE INFORMATION

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D) LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The following are requirements laid down by the government and some incur a penalty if not fulfilled. Please read carefully and make sure you understand what is required.

8. Copyright

Copyright laws are very strictly adhered to. Audio recordings, tapes, CD's photocopying of hymns and orders of service are subject to copyright legislation. Permission must be obtained from the publishers and evidence of this must be shown to the celebrant prior to its use.

9. The Rehearsal

A rehearsal will usually be held on the Thursday prior to the wedding in the church for the bridal party. Please bring to the rehearsal the various fees associated with the marriage as set out at item 17 of this booklet.

10. Ushers

It may be desirable for you to have ushers to show guests where to sit

11. Photographers

Please ask any photographers you might use to be discreet in taking their photographs during the service. It would be a pity for them to be a distraction. Most professional photographers are sensitive to such a request. Photographs may be taken during the signing of the register. No extra lighting for video cameras is to be used in the church.

12. Be on Time

It is important for the bride and her family recognise that there may be other weddings following her wedding, and that she ought not to be late. Beware that photographers do not keep you late while they take their photographs.

13. Recorded Music and the use of Amplifiers in St. Paul's Church

Facilities for recorded music to be played through the church sound system are available. Please ensure that you have permission from the publishers which will need to be sighted before approval can be given.

14. Visiting Priests

Permission will usually be given for an Anglican Priest other than the rector of the Parish to officiate at your wedding. Before any plans are made, discuss this option with the Parish Priest. If another priest is to officiate, then he / she should attend all preparations and instruction. The normal fees should be given to the officiating priest, with the exception that only half the celebrant's fees set out at item 16 need to be paid to the Parish Priest of St. Paul's. In addition, the officiating priest should be paid any fee he / she may require.

15. Visiting Priests and Ministers from other Denomination

Under certain circumstances the Archbishop will give permission for ministers and priests of other denominations to take part in marriages at St. Paul's, but before making plans, please consult the parish priest.

16. Second Marriages

It is now possible for re-marriage after divorce to take place in St. Paul's.

17. Fees Payable for Weddings in the Anglican Parish of St. Paul's

These fees are kept in line with other churches. They should not be thought of as a donation to the church, but for **services rendered**. Please see that these fees are placed

in separate envelopes, marked as follows, and given to the celebrant on the night of the rehearsal:

Celebrant	\$235.00 (A visiting celebrant must pay half to St. Paul's)
Organist	\$150.00
Flowers
Use of church	\$250.00

These fees may all, or in part, be set aside in special circumstances, such as one of the parties to the marriage is a faithful member of the Parish. However, all fees are expected to be paid in the first instance. Should you wish to make a separate gift or thank-offering to the church you are welcome to do so.

18. Fees for Weddings conducted away from St. Paul's

The celebrant's fee is listed in section 16; however a charge of 72 cents per kilometre for the return journey to the priest's home will also apply. All fees are to be paid prior to the marriage taking place.
